POLICY WATCH – MEDICAID CHANGES



INTRODUCTION

Healthcare systems continue to evolve as policies, administrative requirements, and access pathways shift. Increasingly, healthcare access depends not only on eligibility, but on an individual's ability to interpret and navigate complex systems.

This panel highlights emerging Medicare work requirement discussions and the broader literacy and access concerns healthcare advocates and community organizations are closely monitoring.



WHAT'S CHANGING

Some Medicaid recipients may be required to complete or document approximately 80 hours per month of approved activities to maintain coverage.

Approved activities may include:

- Employment
- School enrollment
- Job training participation
- Community volunteering
- Combination activity participation



WHY ADVOCATES ARE CONCERNED

Historically, Medicaid work requirements in several states have resulted in eligible individuals losing coverage due to:

Confusing reporting systems Documentation barriers Communication gaps Administrative complexity Digital access challenges

Many healthcare and advocacy organizations warn that procedural burdens can disproportionately affect populations already navigating structural inequities.
